Rita and Jenna are in York, Pa. this morning and should be back tonight. I am in Orange, Texas. If anyone wants to visit with me by phone or email, please do so. I am only working 10 hrs a day, 7 days a week as of right now, so I will be available after 6 p.m. We are suppose to be working 12 hrs, but as of right now, we are waiting on parts to come in to do the needed repairs.

Many homes and peoples lives were destroyed from hurricane Ike. You drive down streets and see everything they had in their homes out on the streets waiting to be picked up by the city. I notice a gentleman sitting quietly, so I went over and made conversation. He started talking and told me that he had left town per the hurricane warnings. He came back home to a house that had been flooded with 3 feet of salt water. He lost everything that was in the house. When we think we have it bad, we can always look around to see someone who has it worse. He said he has insurance and a brother to stay with. But there are some who do not have either. There are people missing, coffins found floating-- a true disaster. Some in our area have asked if there is anything we can do? I will meet with the elders at the local church tonight and see what they suggest.

Probably the saddest story I have heard so far, is that many were on the bridge coming from Galveston when the storm hit. They did not heed the warning until it was too late. Maybe they thought it wouldn't hit that area, maybe it wouldn't be that strong, or maybe they thought they had plenty of time. Whatever the excuse, the results were the same. We all have warning to heed, let's not make excuses, but prepare for the day. Lk. 12:40

Just as DuPont has people who plan the work needing to be done, if there wasn't anyone that was willing, it would not get done. The same holds true here at Little Hocking.
