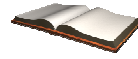

COMMUNION WITH CHRIST

Upon the first day of the week, the church assembles to worship God and remember the death of His Son for our sins (Acts 20:7; 1 Cor. 11:23-34). It is an observance of the sacrifice of Christ and His resurrection on the first day of the week.

In partaking of the Lord's Supper each Sunday, we have the greatest privilege to have communion with Jesus Christ. I dare not miss this special blessing that God granted to all in His family. The Word of Christ adds the saved to His church, because they obeyed the gospel by repentance and baptism for remission of sins (Acts 2:37-47) The saved assemble as the church to express union with Christ and with one another – **1 Corinthians 10:16-17.**

Christians obey the commandments of Jesus to observe His death as a memorial of hope, proclaiming His return and preparing ourselves for eternal life with Christ. If I fail to observe His death each Sunday, I forget His death and will also forget to live for Him. If I intentionally miss a Sunday, I show that I do not care about His death:

“How much worse punishment, suppose you, shall he be thought worthy, who has trodden under foot the Son of God, and has counted the blood of the covenant, with which he was sanctified, an unholy thing, and has done insult unto the Spirit of grace?” (Hebrews 10:29)

For God's blessings, we partake every Lord's Day and structure our mind to:

- Look **BACKWARD** and remember the death of Christ
- Look **INWARD** and examine our self
- Look **OUTWARD** to those lost in sin and proclaim our faith in the Lord's sacrifice
- Look **FORWARD** in anticipation of His return.
