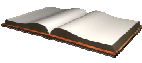

Luke 4:4 And Jesus answered the devil, saying, it is written, that man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God.

In Matthew 7:11-14 Jesus said if ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father who is in heaven give good things to them that ask him?
