A pleasant good morning to all! We're glad that you are here. If you are visiting this morning we want you to know that we are very glad that you are here and encourage you to join with us as we worship God in spirit and truth. Please come back any and all times that you can.

What a privilege it is to be part of this congregation. Because of your generosity and desire to do the Lords work we have done a lot. Being good stewards of the weekly contribution is a very serious matter. I am very thankful for the men of our congregation that attend to this matter. Last year, through November we gave **\$5,600.00** to support **national and local mission work** and over **\$5,000.00** to **benevolent needs**. I have listed some of the benevolence/mission work we have supported since November and their web sites. If you have access to the internet, check them out.

- **\$1,000.00** to support the children at **Potters Children Home** (this is in addition to the gleaner cans that you fill) (www.potterministries.org)
- **\$1,000.00** to support the children at **Village of Hope** and the **Water Well Drilling** in Ghana West Africa (www.gwam.org) The following is part of their letter to us;
“In the past you have helped us to do the Lords work in Ghana. Your kindness in helping to bless the people of Ghana with fresh, clean water and helping orphaned and abandoned children to have happier, healthier, better lives has been a wonderful example of what our Savior did for us. Many have given their lives to Christ because of what you have shared with them. Heaven will be fuller and God is and will be glorified because of you. Thank You”
- **\$1,000.00** to support the **Sonlight Children’s Home** in Port-au- Prince, Haiti (post earthquake support through the Estes Church of Christ in Tenn.) (www.estes.tn.org)
- **\$1,000.00** to **Hope for Haiti’s Children** (post earthquake support through the church in Houston) (www.hopeforhaitischildren.org)
- **\$3,500.00** to the **Guyana Mission work**. Dave, Jean, Robin and I thank you very much. This money (some of this was sent to support Bob Long and Tom Tucker) was a big part in allowing us to go. Dave will have a full report when we get back.
